MedCruise appointed member of the recent launched European Ports Forum Sub-group on Sustainable Ports

The Commission Expert Group European Ports Forum (EPF) have met three times since its launching back in December 2017. MedCruise Association, permanent member of the EPF, have attended with success the three meetings.

Main tasks of the EPF are to:

- exchange information on policies and initiatives taken at Commission level, Member State level or by port-industry stakeholders and contributing to the priorities identified in the Valencia Ministerial Declaration of 10 April 2017 on the EU Maritime Transport Policy;
- provide advice to the Commission on initiatives to promote and support a uniform implementation of Regulation (EU) 2017/752 establishing a framework for the provision of port services and common rules on the financial transparency of ports;
- support the cooperation between Member State authorities on matters arising from the implementation of the above-mentioned Regulation;
- provide advice, analysis, information and data to the Commission to follow-up and monitor the strategy and actions outlined in its Communication 'Ports: an engine for growth' (COM (2018) 285) and, if necessary, update it;
- provide advice, analysis, information and data to the Commission on any other matters related to the various Commission policies with an impact on maritime ports.

The first meeting kicked off in establishing the terms of reference and the rules of procedure of the Forum. Of particular interest was the item that would be permanently in the agenda of the EPF, the implementation of the provision of port services and common rules on the financial transparency of ports.

The European Commission gave an overview of the upcoming legislative milestones and the Member States were asked to either report progress or to ask

questions on the implementation. Other presentations were made during the day by DG Competition and by DG MARE on the blue growth hub. The meeting came to an end with the report presentation from the European Transport Forum (ETF), which focused on addressing shipping CO₂ emissions, lessons from port-based initiatives. This was complemented by a presentation made by EPOD and FICOR on the initiatives undertaken by ports in relation to environment sustainability.

In the second meeting, next hub place in June 2018, two sub-groups were presented. These were to be launched in 2019 and their Terms of Reference would be:

- Ports as hubs for Blue Growth. The purpose of the Sub-group will be to make suggestions and share good practices among ports as well as to identify and discuss challenges and solutions.
- Sustainable Ports Subgroup will promote port greening initiatives and address environmental issues by exchanging information on policies, developing guidelines on zero emissions, promoting environmental initiatives such as on-shore power supply (OPS), and providing information on any other matters related to environmental policies with an impact on maritime ports.

Third meeting took place in December 2018. Talk of Sustainable Ports Subgroup were approved and MedCruise applied to become a member. MedCruise representative appointment for next three years was confirmed last week. Talk regarding Ports as hubs for Blue Growth Sub-group will be approved in subsequent meetings.

Finally, information regarding financial instruments and opportunities for ports such as CEF 2014-2020 and EPN/IB was provided. For instance, CEI 2020 CEI Transport call for proposals, where ports in comprehensive TEN-T network will be eligible.

Sustainable growth strategies

MedCruiSe is teaming up with key associations to help drive the sustainable growth of the cruise industry in the Mediterranean. Theodora Riga speaks with Rebecca Gibson

Cooperation and collaboration will be a top priority for MedCruiSe in 2024. The association works with 30 association members from cruise-related organizations and 71 port authorities from 21 countries, to develop and promote tourism in the Mediterranean Sea, North Africa and near Adjacent Seas. MedCruiSe is working on its collaborative efforts and joining forces with the likes of Cruise Lines International Association, Cruise Europe, the European Sea Ports Organisation, the World

Association of Waterborne Transport Infrastructure, Cruise in PANACEA, International Association of Ports and Harbors, and many other international cruise port association networks. Together, these associations aim to regulate new regulations, policies and best practices with other national and international organizations, such as the European Union, and propel the Mediterranean and its adjacent seas into the future.

The press talked with regarding these partnerships and ensuring they drive value for all involved is Theodora Riga, MedCruiSe's Director for Cooperation with Other Associations. "It's responsible for managing communication with all local, national and

international associations that are involved in our sector," she says. "We make sure we have a working relationship that drives cooperation with all of these associations and provides a platform that will be a MedCruiSe initiative."

"This will help us to develop a solid approach to working together and creating new opportunities as we can help create industry in the Med and to attract new operators over time. We'll also be able to develop new or better products for the region's cruise business."

Together, says Riga, MedCruiSe, its members and its association partners will work with many of them and establish a Pan-European dialogue that will bring together each association's unique expertise for operators' benefit. "It's a really big step," she says, "having expertise and maintaining active and close collaboration has been a constant goal for us. Harber is of a similar opinion to that regarding the term "hub" when applied to cruise facilities. "This is only a marketing reference to a perfect infrastructure and service for turnaround calls," he says. "In our opinion the word 'hub' has a very positive connotation, such as networking, learning problem, long queues. That's why we would never call ourselves a 'hub'."

"We can't see any advantages in calling our port a hub as it simply implies that the port is able to handle a high turnaround volume." In fact, he says, "This may be a disadvantage because partners, cruise lines or other players in the environmental activities will then think of cruise as a mere business indicator."

Harber stresses that, although Columbus Cruise Center demonstrates its ability in doing everything possible to decrease its environmental footprint in the office, on the shore or with regard to company cars – it can only electric forklifts – the sustainability of making cruise ships a separate matter, he explains, how expensive the facilities offered by a port, "reasonable pollution by ships, including cruise ships, is not a matter for ports. We are responsible for our work, while they are responsible for the original."

"The ship of the shipping lines, including cruise lines, are not sailing up to us to correct themselves. It's the ship that is responsible for providing this. It should be also corrected by the original."

Some cruise locations may see growth driven by other port activities. In Scotland, for example, offshore wind has led to a £20 million investment which will accommodate the largest modern cruise ship at Invergoron. The development is being designed to meet the demands of both the energy and the cruise components of the port's business, and will be completed by 2025.

"We are committed to helping to ensure that it fits the bill as far as the accepted definition of a cruise hub is concerned," he says. "It will be to increase its capacity to welcome cruise ships, with identification under way. The world's largest sea loch at the entrance of the North Sea Canal at IJmuiden."

Sustainability is also high on Amsterdam's agenda. "Hub ports have a responsibility to take care of all
