opportunities. The Association supports its members (Ports and Associates) in achieving sustainable growth in their cruise activities.

As of 2023, the Association boasts 76 port members from 22 countries spanning three continents: Africa, Asia and Europe. It represents over 153 ports and 53 associate members.

MedCruise’s objectives include promoting the Mediterranean region as a cruise destination; enhancing the operational efficiency of its port members through the exchange of industry insights and best practices; advocating for sustainability in all facets of its business; formulating unified positions on matters of shared interest; fostering positive relations within the cruise industry and providing its

The report

The annual MedCruise Statistics Report is among the Association’s flagship publications, representing cruise ports in the Mediterranean and its adjoining seas. It details an actual picture of cruise activities in the region over the past years. It reveals the latest trends and enables an understanding of present-day challenges for ports, cruise lines, destinations and all stakeholders.

In an industry that demonstrates remarkable capacity for resilience, growth and change this report also provides a useful database and analysis of the trends that were recorded in the second largest cruise region in the world, during 2023. In line with 2022, 2023 has witnessed a remarkable recovery for the industry, surpassing its pre-pandemic performance.

This report forms part of a series of studies conducted or commissioned by MedCruise that examine issues relevant to cruise ports. By advancing information on industry developments, organisation, administration, management and promoting best practices, these studies help to increase the efficiency of MedCruise ports and associate members.

Benchmarking and the sharing of knowledge on several topics, including operational, regulatory and financial issues are core parts of the life of the Association. These studies are also discussed jointly with cruise lines during the MedCruise General Assemblies, allowing MedCruise members to better understand the findings, identify the responses and make use of the results.

MedCruise membership

MedCruise's membership spans 22 countries in the Mediterranean and its adjoining seas (Table 1.1).

Out of the 76 port members in MedCruise, 26 are entities overseeing multiple ports within the same region, comprising 34.21% of the association's membership (see Figure 1.1). This diversity underscores the varied structures of governance and organization among cruise ports. The overall number of ports within the MedCruise network stands at 153.

Moreover, 53 associate members, representing tourist boards, ship agents, port agents as well as other cruise industry related organisations, also share the benefits of being part of the MedCruise family. MedCruise is regularly upgrading its associate members programme, aiming to increase the prospects of the respective destinations. The list of the MedCruise associate members as of 31st December 2023 is detailed in Table 1.2.

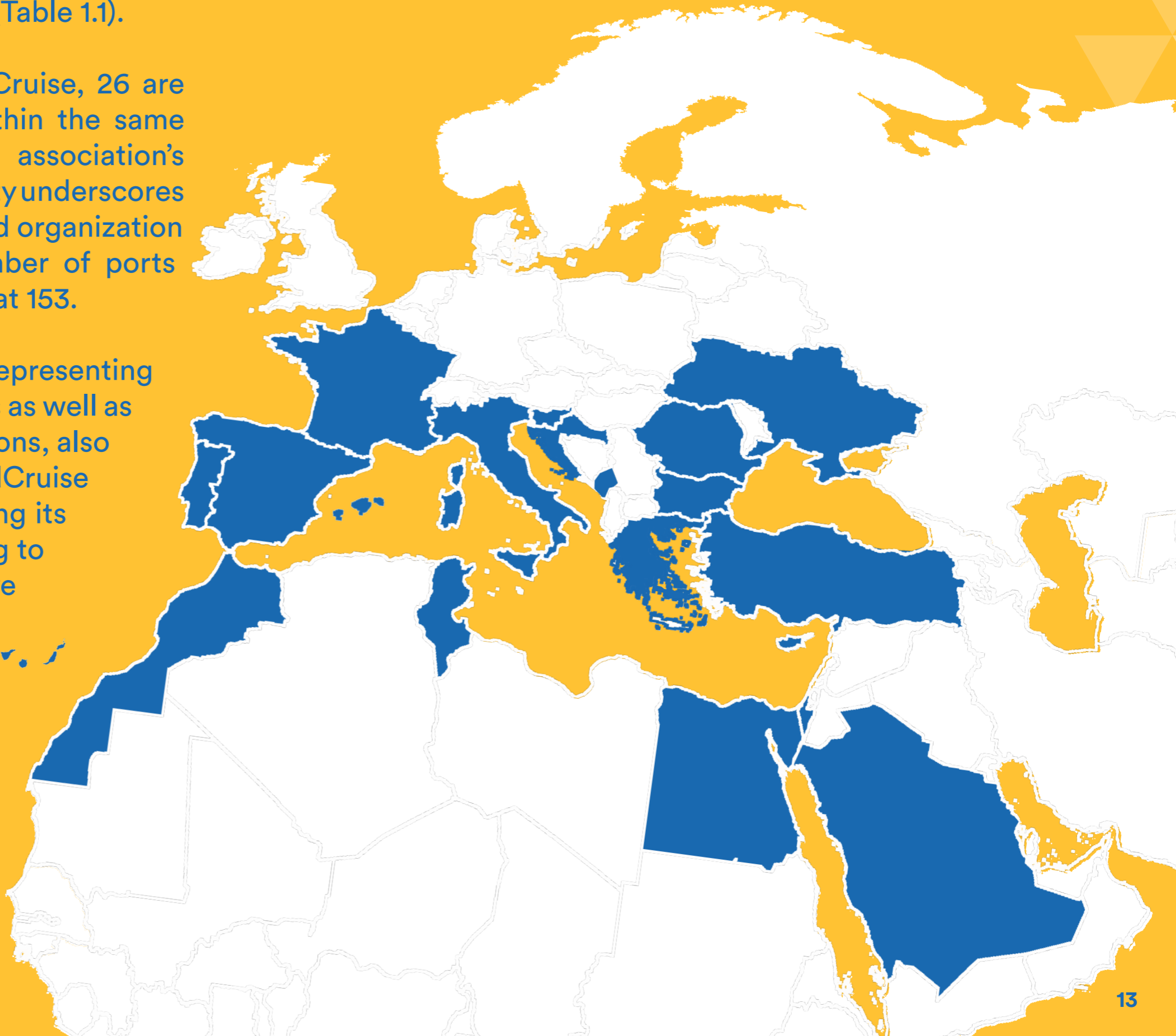

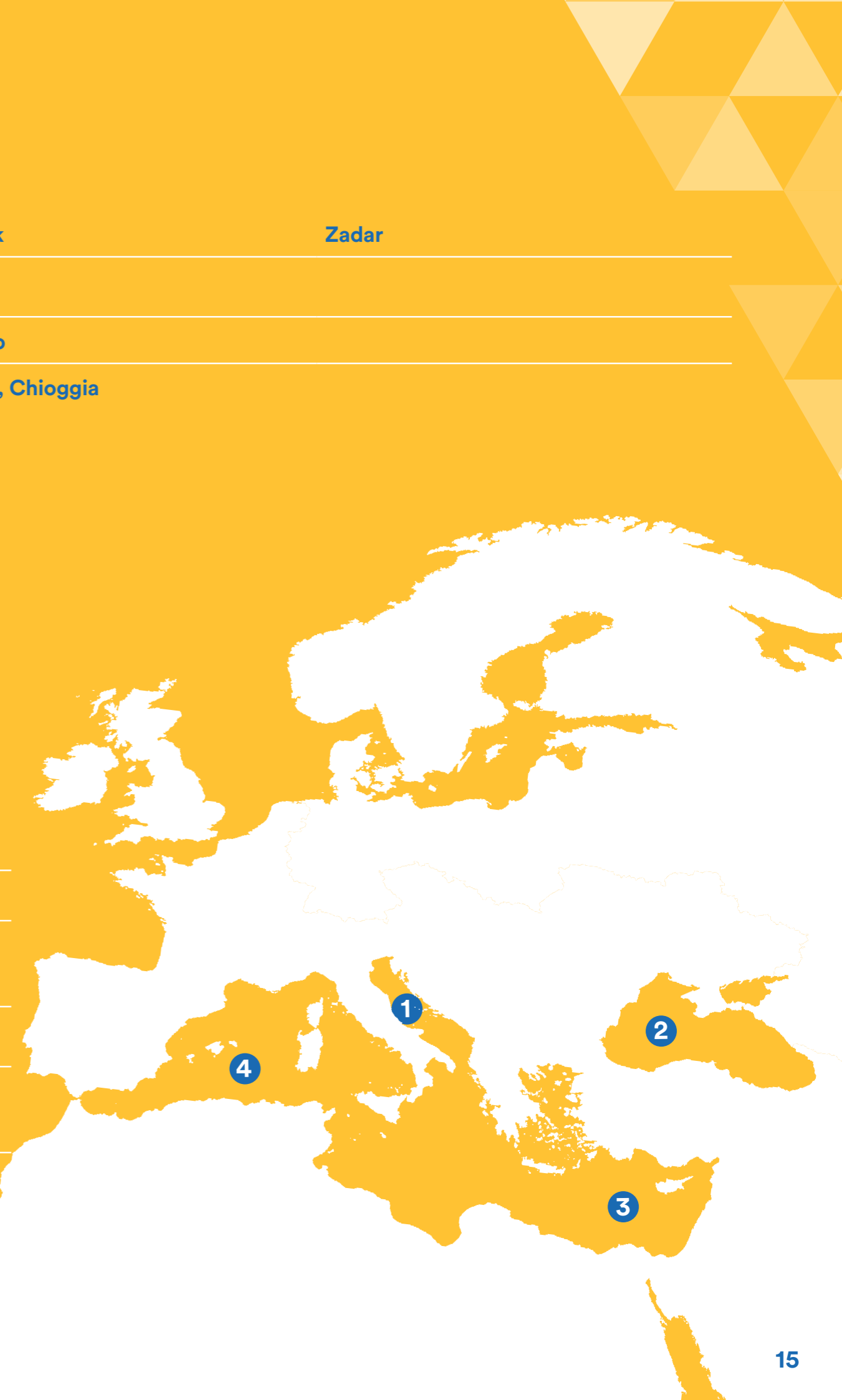

1.4 Evolution of the cruise activity in MedCruise ports

The total number of cruise passenger movements at MedCruise Ports during 2023 reached almost 32,94 million (Figure 1.2), officially surpassing pre-pandemic results and marking a clear recovery of the cruise industry in the MedCruise region, with a growth of 35.13% from

2022. All in all, the cruise world did not remain unaffected by the pandemic that changed social and economic lives around the globe over the last years – justifying the comprehensive efforts developed by cruise ports in the region to generate conditions that secure their resilience to all types of crises.

The total number of cruise ship calls was 14,657 in MedCruise Ports in 2023 (Figure 1.3) and is almost stagnant compared to 2022. The slight 0.66% decrease of calls reflects the facts that the ships’ capacity visiting our ports and their onboard occupancies are increasing rather than the number of calls.

Cruise pax movements in MedCruise ports, 2000-2023 (millions)

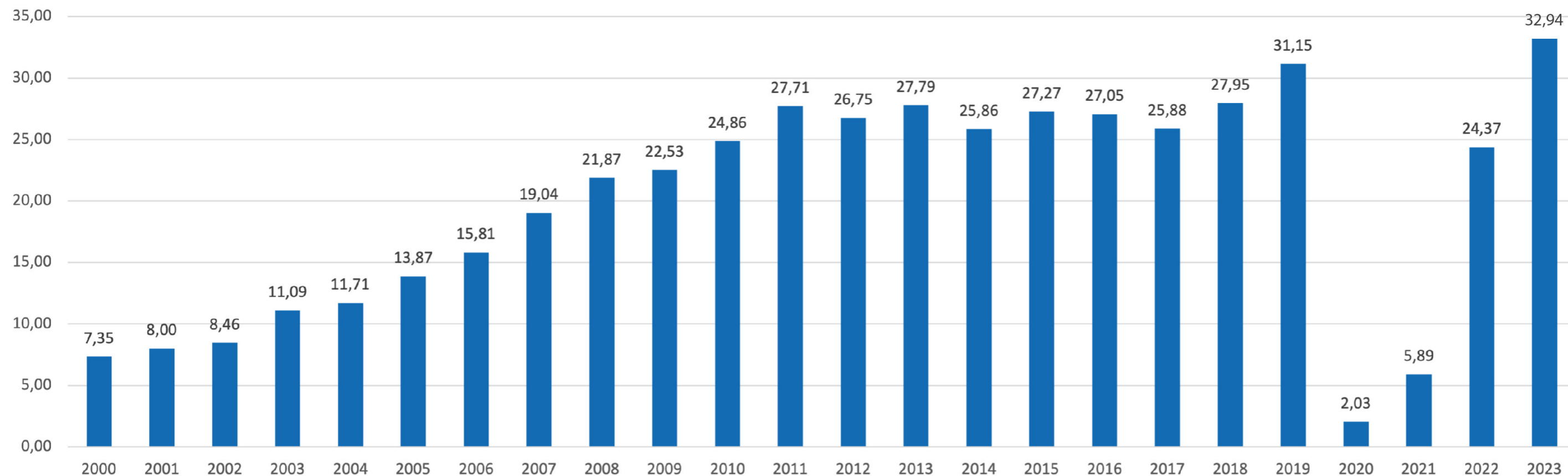

Cruise calls in MedCruise ports 2000-2023 (thousands)

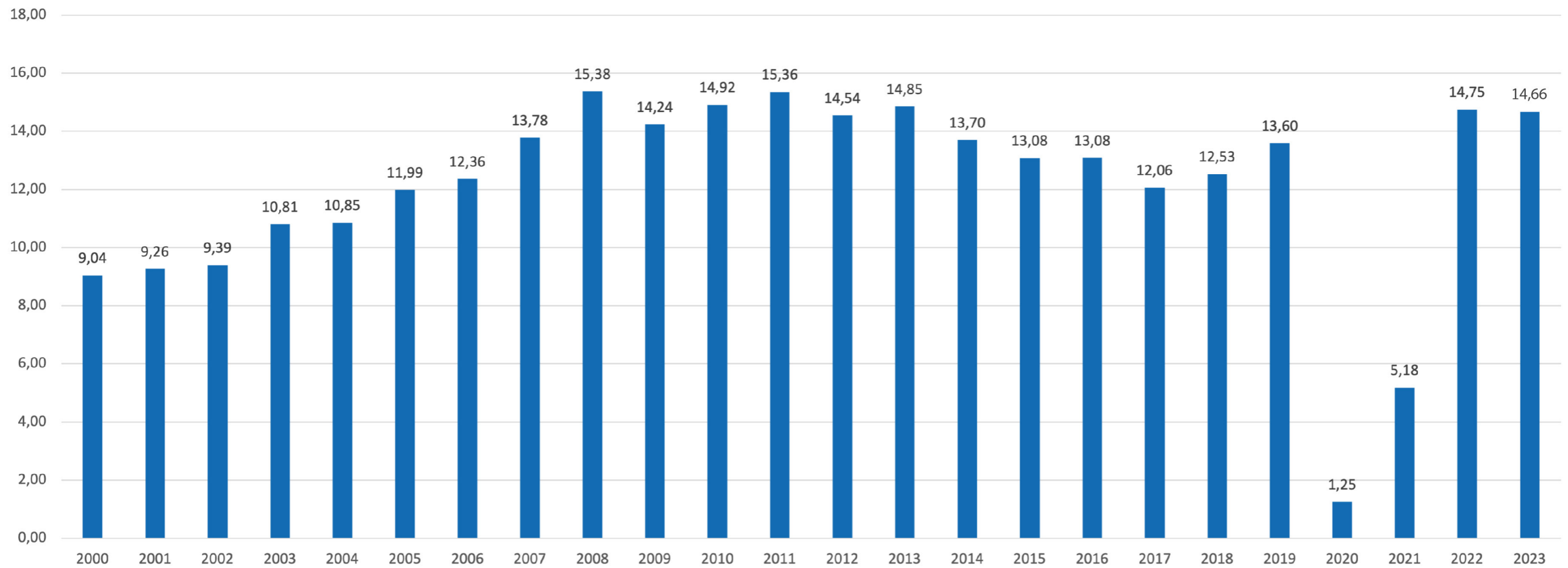
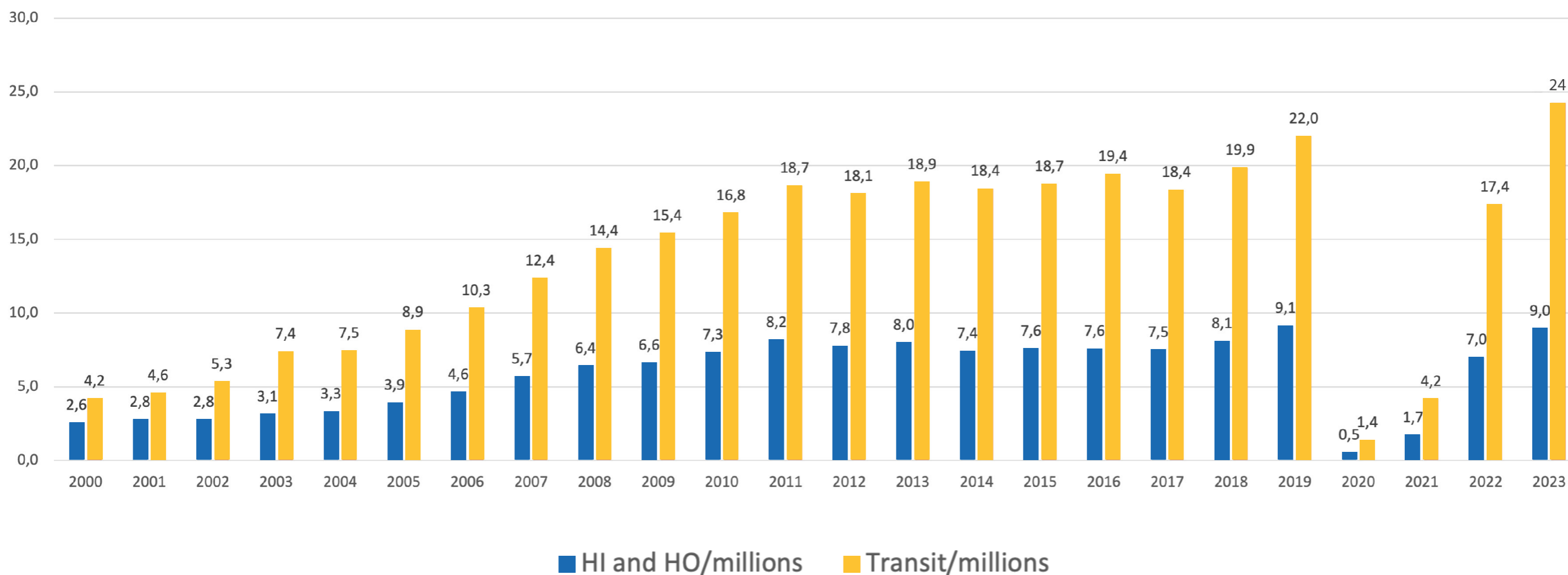

Four cruise ports in the Med and its adjoining seas hosted more than 2,5 million passenger movements in 2023 and top the list of the ports with the most significant traffic (Figure 1.5). These are Barcelona (3,568,901), Marseille (2,600,000), Genoa and Savona (2,560,388) and Balearic Islands (2,519,427).

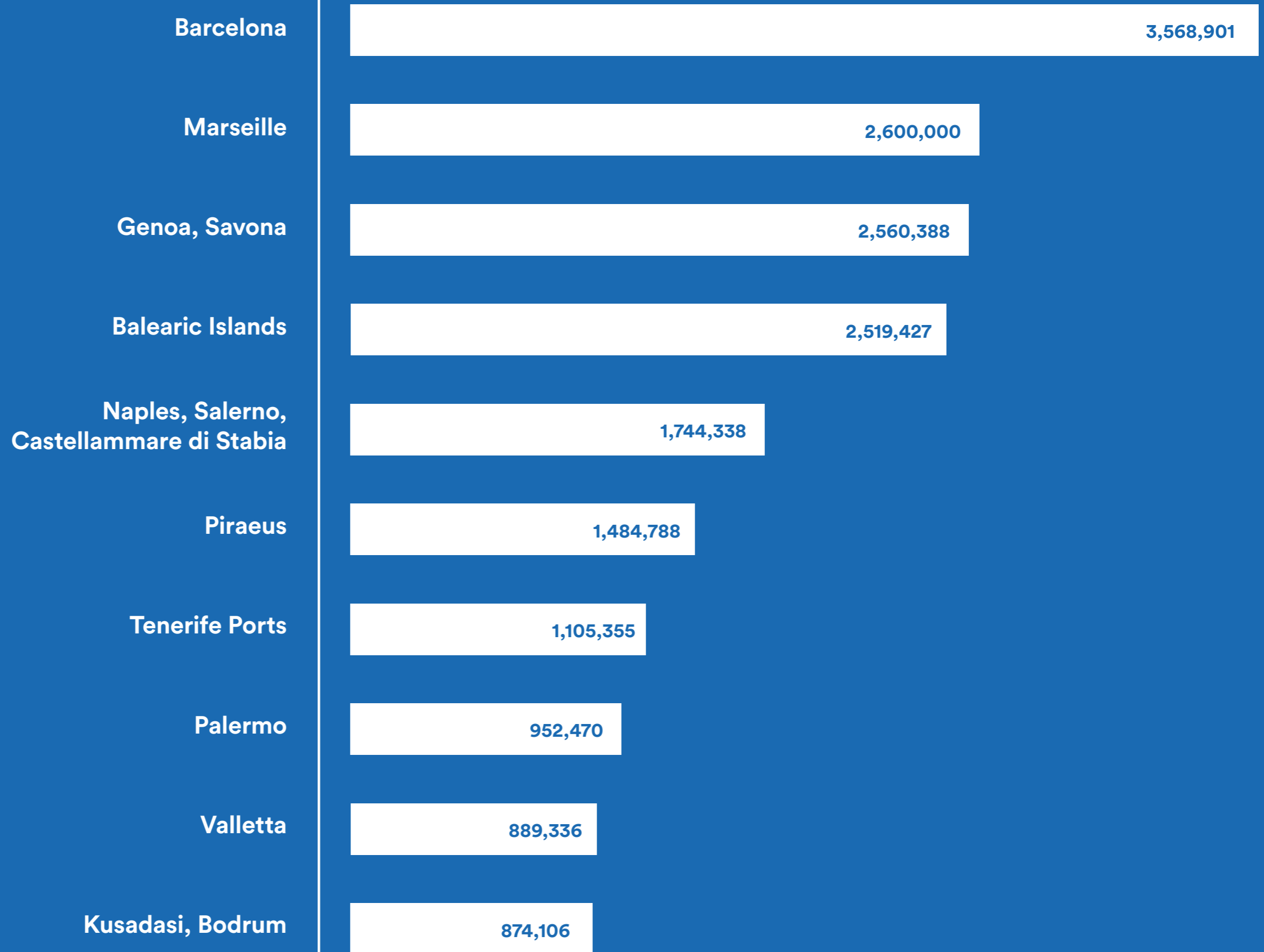

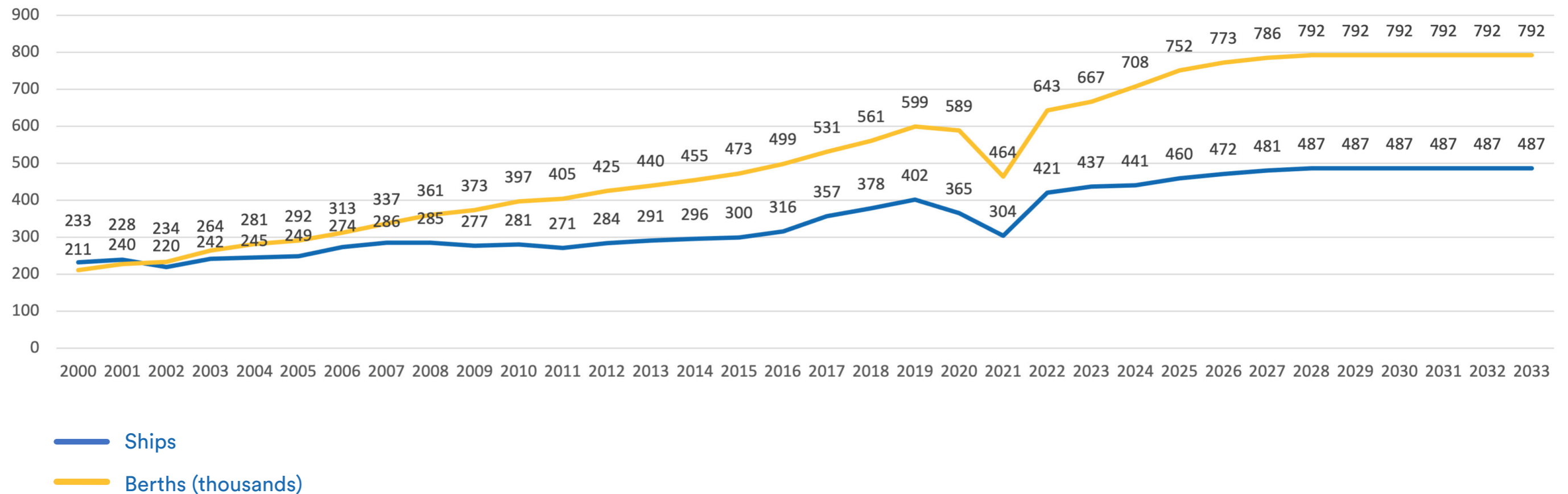

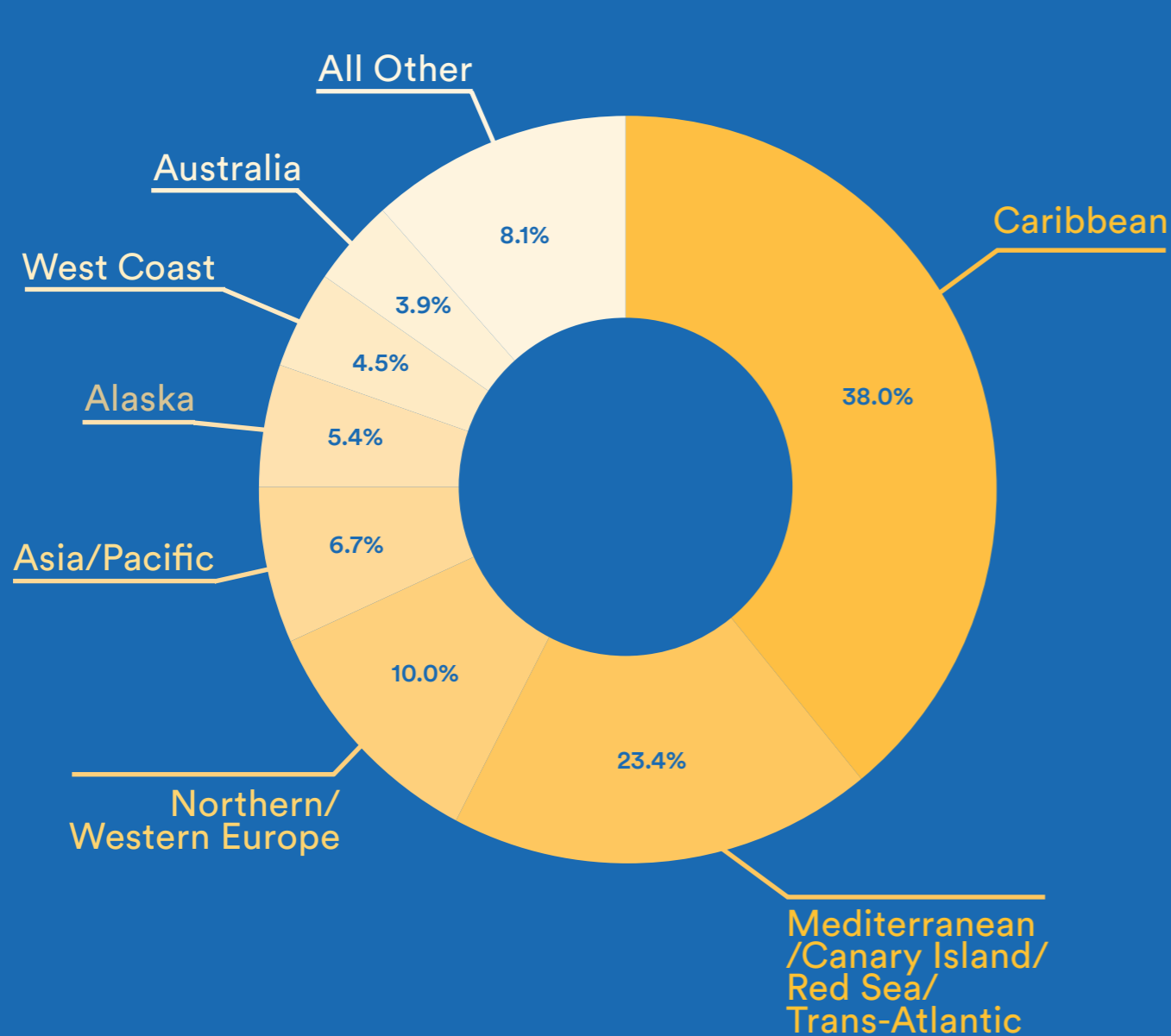

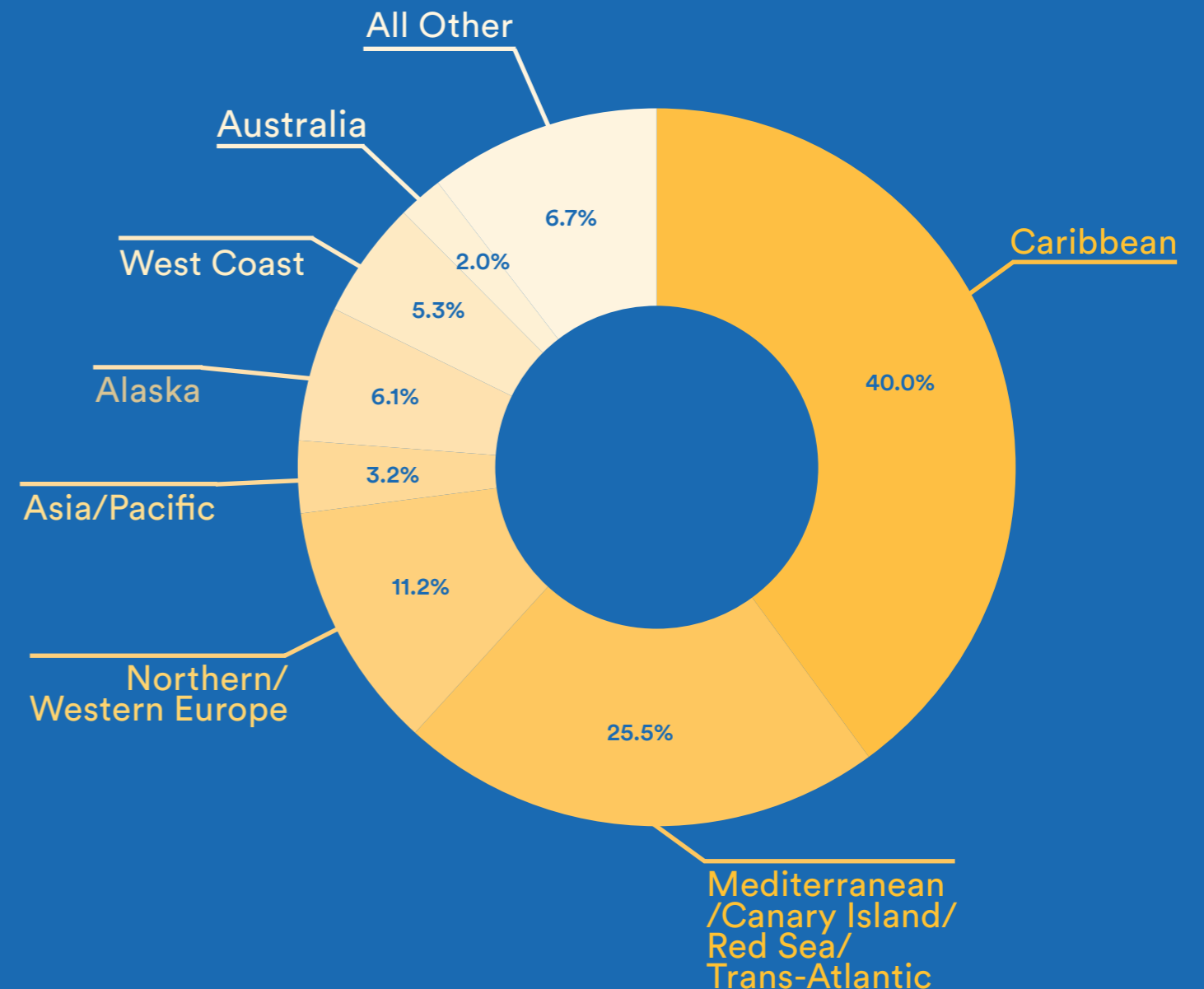
Figure 2.2 Global deployment shares

Cruise activity trends in the Mediterranean and its adjoining seas



3.1 Evolution of cruise traffic in MedCruise ports (2019-2023)

This section offers an examination of cruise passenger movements and cruise ship calls within the MedCruise ports. This analysis is based on data recorded by MedCruise Port members, representing a sample covering approximately 80% of passengers that cruise the Mediterranean and its adjoining seas annually.

Therefore, this analysis provides a precise insight into the trends of cruise activity within the second largest cruise region globally.

In total, 32,936,361 cruise passenger movements were registered in MedCruise Ports in 2023 (Table 3.1). This represents an increase of 35.13% in passenger movements compared to the previous year, as well as an increase of 1,519.45% compared to 2020 and an increase of 5.75% compared to 2019. These figures indicate a recovery after the pandemic and growth in the sector.

With regard to the number of passengers per call, there was a 36.02% increase in the number of passengers visiting a port per call. In 2023, the passengers per call amounted to 2,247, representing a slight decrease of 1.91% compared to 2019.

The full list of ports included in this analysis, along with the raw material for passenger movements and cruise calls for 2023 as well as for the four previous years (2019-2022) can be found in the Appendix I of this report.

3.2 Major MedCruise ports

In 2023 the 10 major MedCruise ports, in terms of cruise passenger movements, hosted more than 18 million passenger movements (Table 3.2). All ports included in this list registered positive variations over 2020, with an increase in movements of 521.64% and an overall increase of 22.63% compared to 2019.

As for cruise calls, the top 10 MedCruise ports collectively reached a total of 6,060 calls (Table 3.3). Barcelona, Spain, led the list with 803 calls, followed by Piraeus, Greece, with 760 calls and Balearic Islands, Spain, with 758 calls. The most significant variation in 2023 compared to 2020 was observed in Kusadasi/Bodrum at 15,750%, along with the

highest variation from 2019, which stood at 200%.

It is noteworthy that the overall increase in cruise calls for these top 10 ports has been 10% compared to the pre-pandemic numbers of 2019.

In total, 49 cruise ports recorded home-porting activities in 2023, embarking and disembarking passengers. In 17 of them this number was higher than 170,000 passenger movements. The ten ports with the most substantial home-porting activity collectively welcomed a total of 6,860,107 passengers in and out, marking a 55% increase compared to 2022 (as indicated in Table 3.4).

Barcelona, Spain, was the most popular cruise home-port in the Med, recording 1,906,857 Home In/Out passengers. Following closely were Genoa & Savona, Italy, with 1,132,947 Home In/Out passengers.

The total of transit cruise passenger movements in the major MedCruise Ports has also increased in 2023 by 56.21% compared to 2022 and by 28.71% compared to

2019 (Table 3.5). All the ports in this top-10 contributed to generating the overall positive variation. Marseille, France, and Balearic Islands, Spain, top the list.

3.4 Passengers per call

The deployment of bigger vessels in the Mediterranean and the adjoining seas has been a key future of the cruise market throughout the 21st century. The trend was reflected in the continuous increase of the average number of cruise passengers that reach a destination per call. In 2019, the average number of passengers hosted per cruise call was 2,291.

However, since then, there has been a remarkable reversal of this trend. In 2020, the average number of passenger movements per cruise call in the Med dropped significantly to 1,622. This figure further decreased in 2021 to 1,137 passengers per call. Subsequently, in 2022, there was a resurgence, with the average number of passengers per call rising again to 1,652. By 2023, the results had rebounded to pre-pandemic levels, with an average of 2,247 hosted passengers per cruise call.

Nine MedCruise member ports hosted calls that, on average, resulted in more than 3,000 pax per call (Figure 3.2). It is worth noting that in 2022, only the port of Genoa and Savona surpassed the 3,000 passengers per call threshold.

Average pax/call in MedCruise ports (2000-2023)

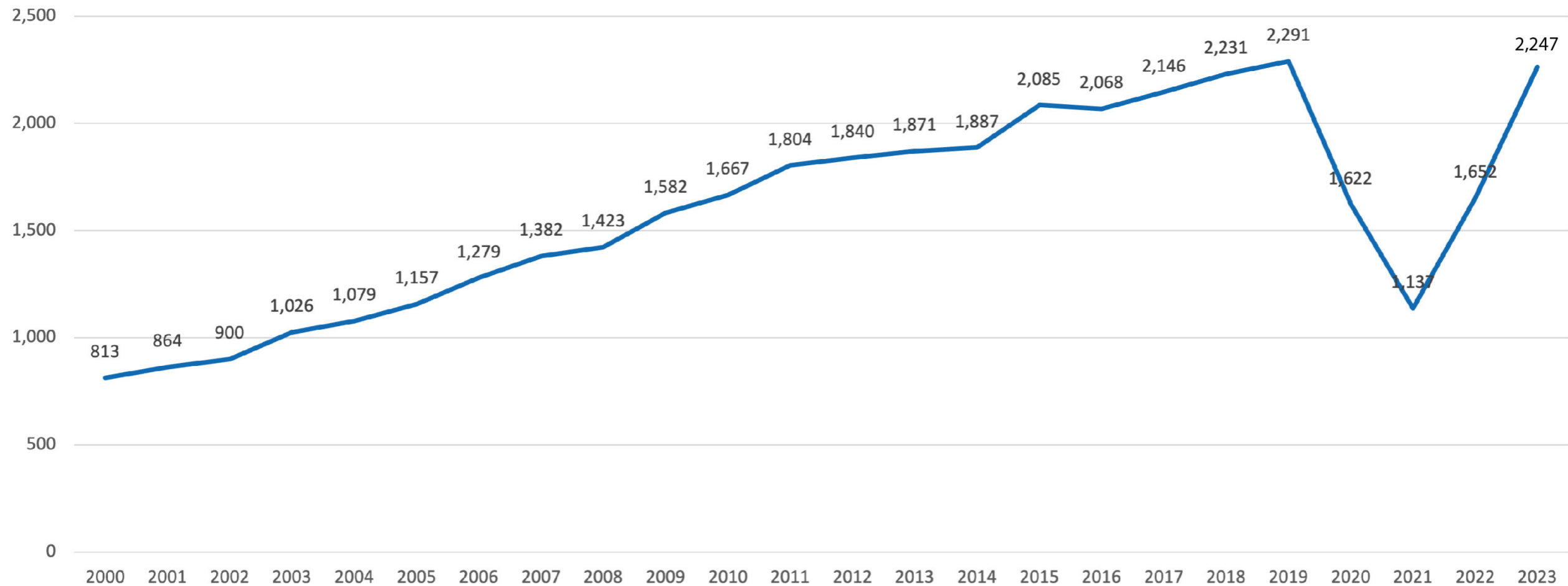
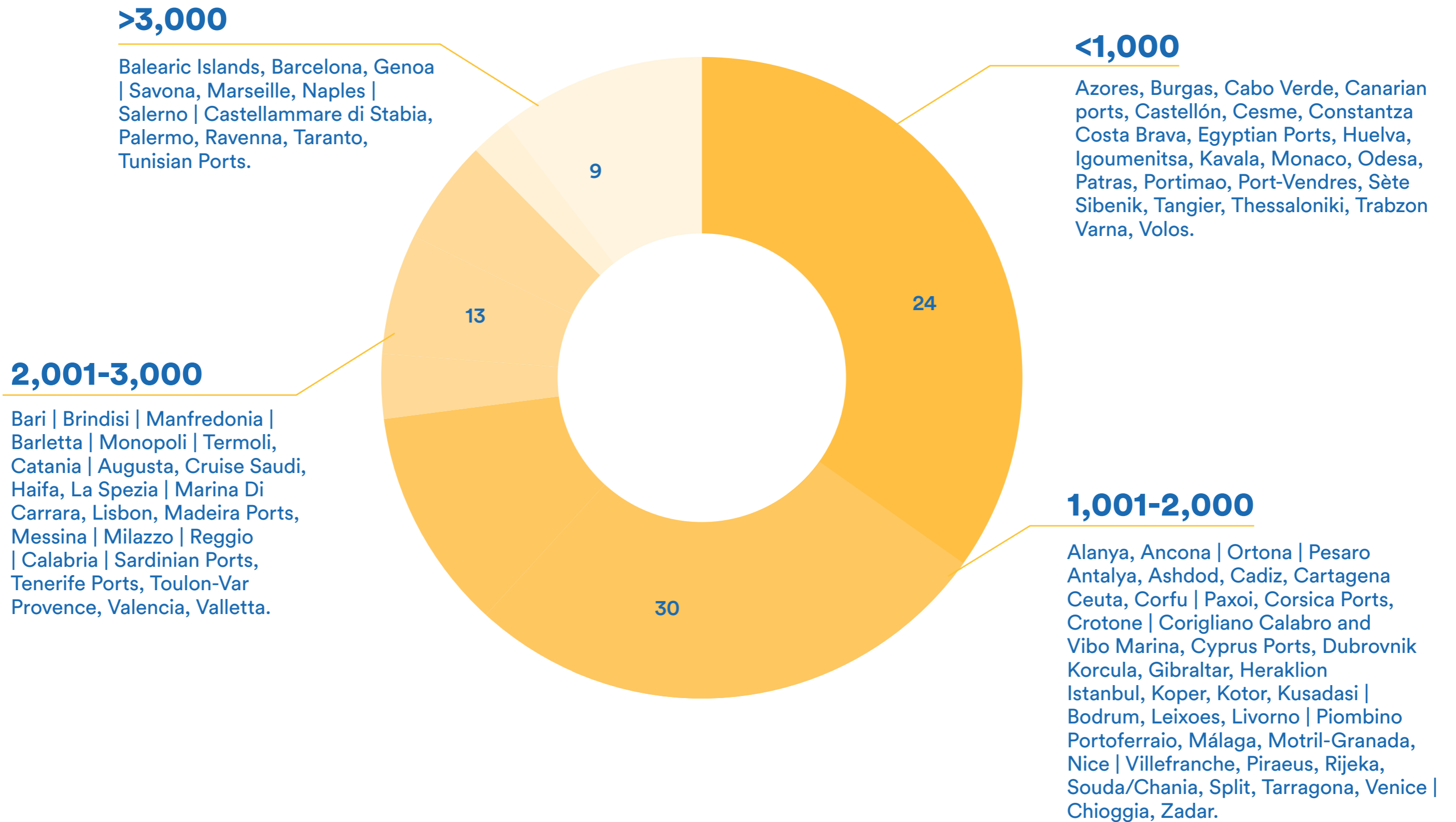

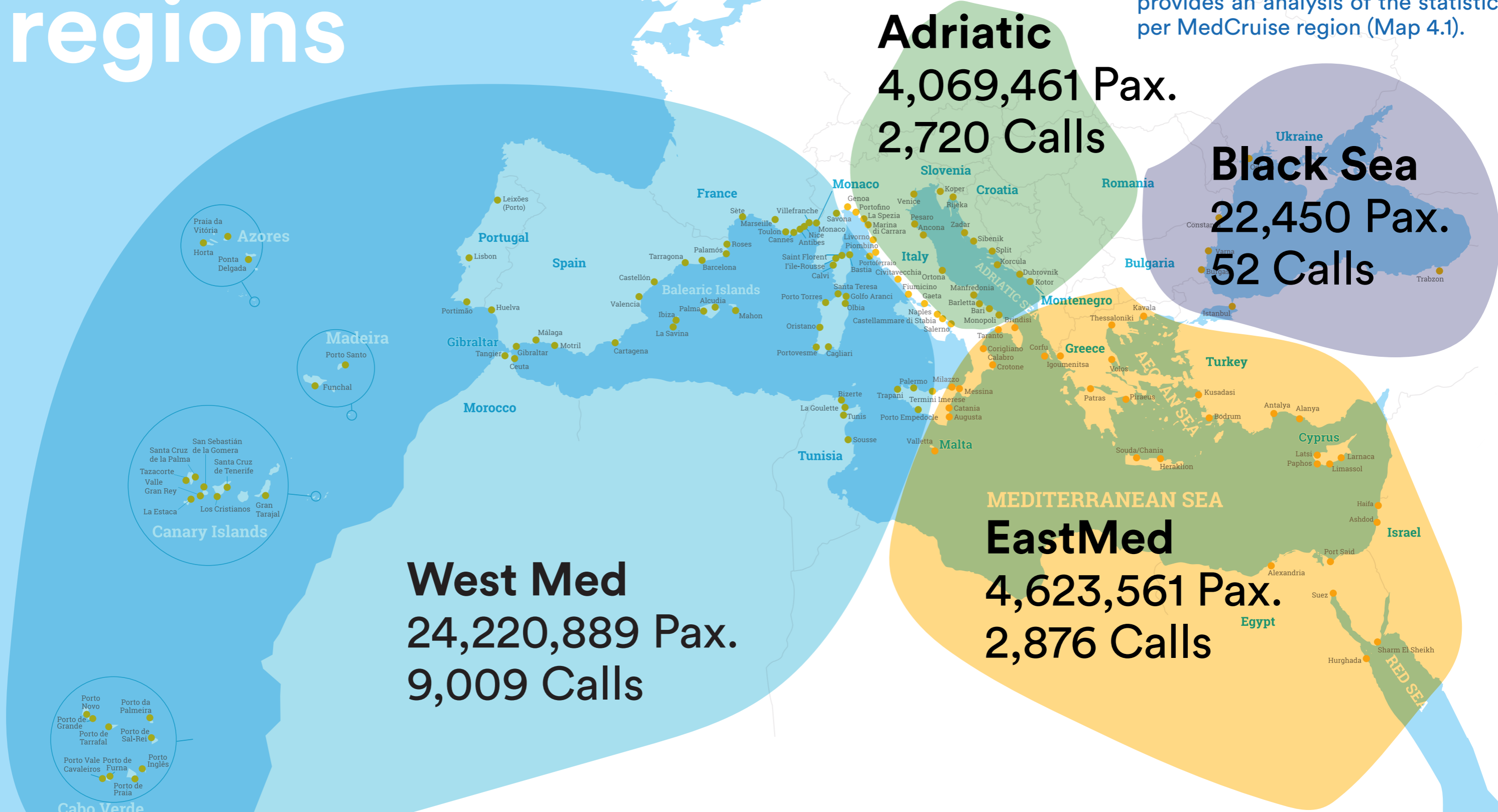

4.1 The MedCruise regions

MedCruise membership spreads out over four distinct geographical regions, each of them having its own dynamics. These regions are the Adriatic, Black Sea, East Med and West Med. This section of the report provides an analysis of the statistics per MedCruise region (Map 4.1).

4.1 The MedCruise regions

A total of 40 MedCruise members are located in the West Med region (Table 4.1). The cruise passenger movements that took place in these ports in 2023 reached more than 24 million. The total cruise calls in the region over the same period were 9,009. The East Med was the second most popular region in 2023, hosting more than 4 million passenger movements, with 2,876 calls.

The West Med remains the busiest region of the four in terms of the share of cruise activities. In 2023 it hosted 73.54% of the total passenger movements and 61.47% of the cruise calls.

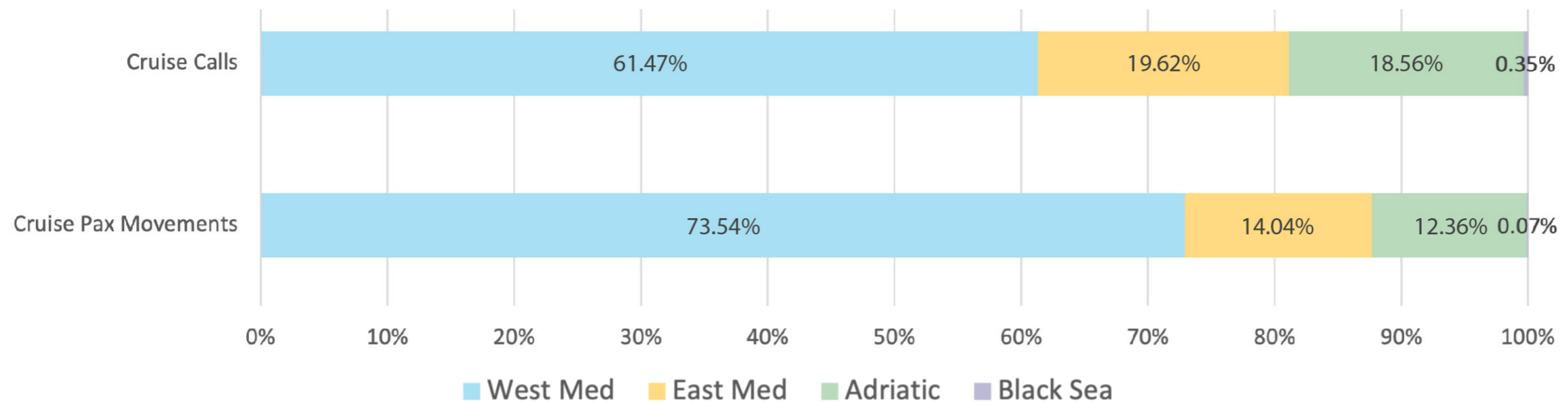

Cruise pax movements traffic share per region(2023)



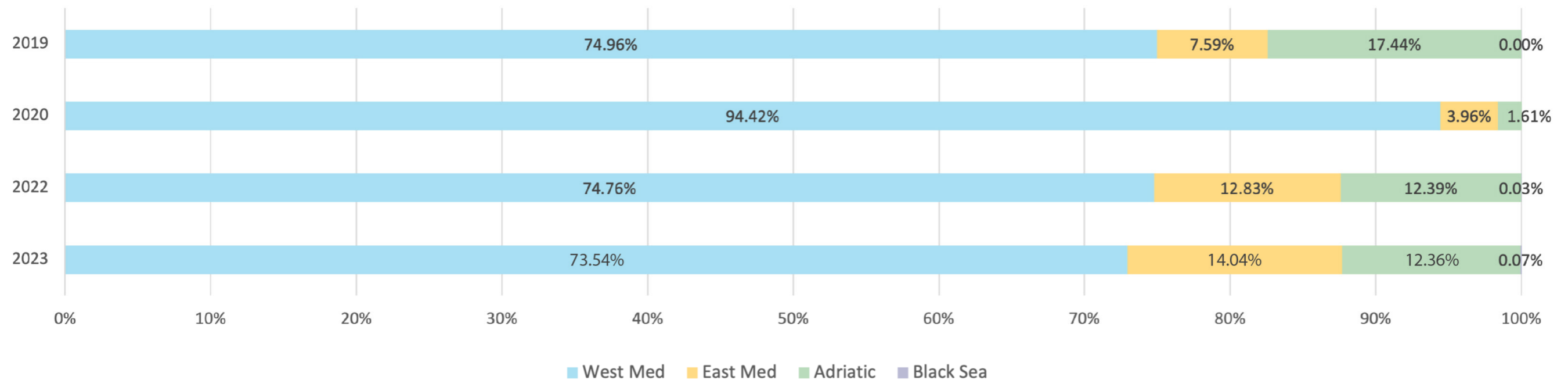
4.2 Cruise traffic evolution per region

Table 4.2 details the evolution and variation of cruise passenger movements, providing an overview of both short and mid-term trends. In 2023, all regions experienced growth compared not only to 2022, with an increase of 35.13%, but also 2020, with an increase of 1,519.45% and 2019 (pre-pandemic results) with an increase of 5.75%.

Cruise pax movements traffic share per region (2023)



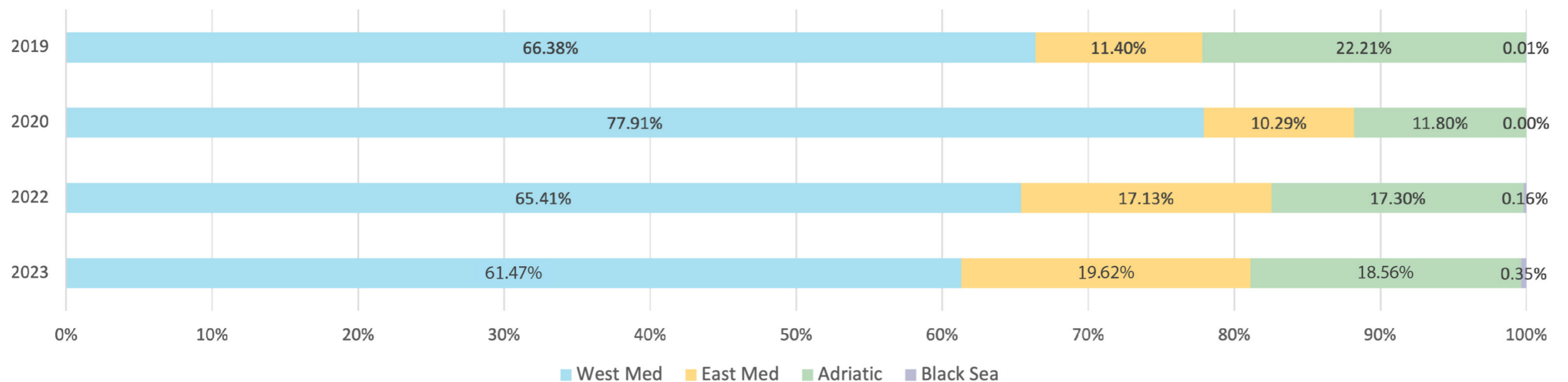
4.2 Cruise traffic evolution per region

As regards the total number of cruise calls per region (Table 4.3), all the regions registered higher numbers of calls when compared to 2022. Compared to 2020 -the pandemic year-, the four regions have shown an increase in total cruise calls of 1,068.82% and an increase of 7.80% compared to 2019.

Cruise calls share evolution per region (2023)



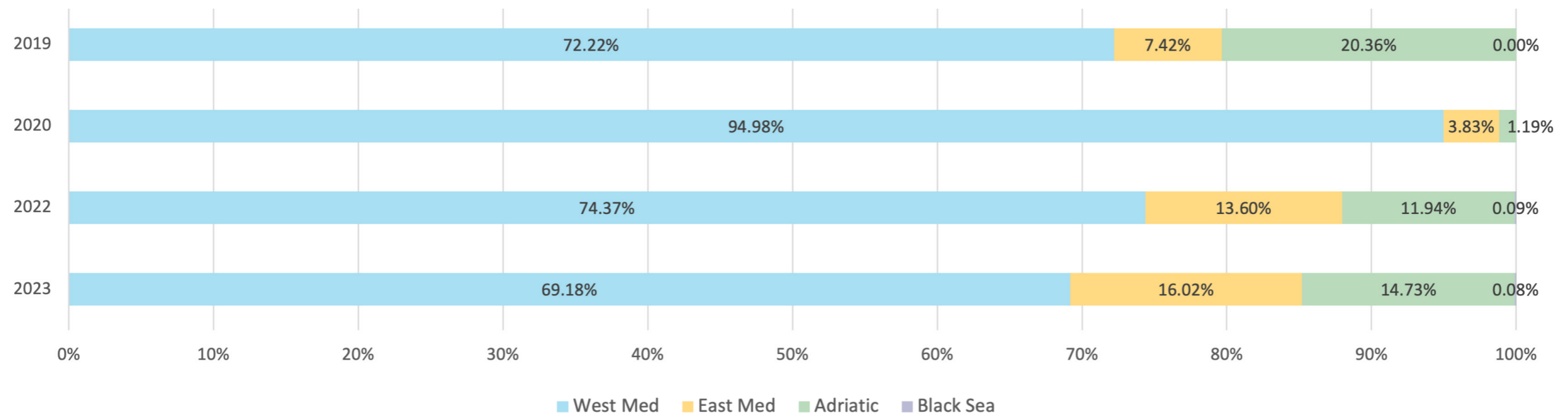
4.2 Cruise traffic evolution per region

The total of home in/out passengers in the region reached almost 9 million in 2023, with an increase of 1,578.74% compared to 2020 (Table 4.4) and slight decrease of 1.93% compared to the results before the pandemic. The West Med has been the region where most home-porting activities have traditionally taken place. Figure 4.4 illustrates the shares of Home In/Out passengers per MedCruise region over the last year.

Cruise home in/out pax movements share evolution per region (2023)



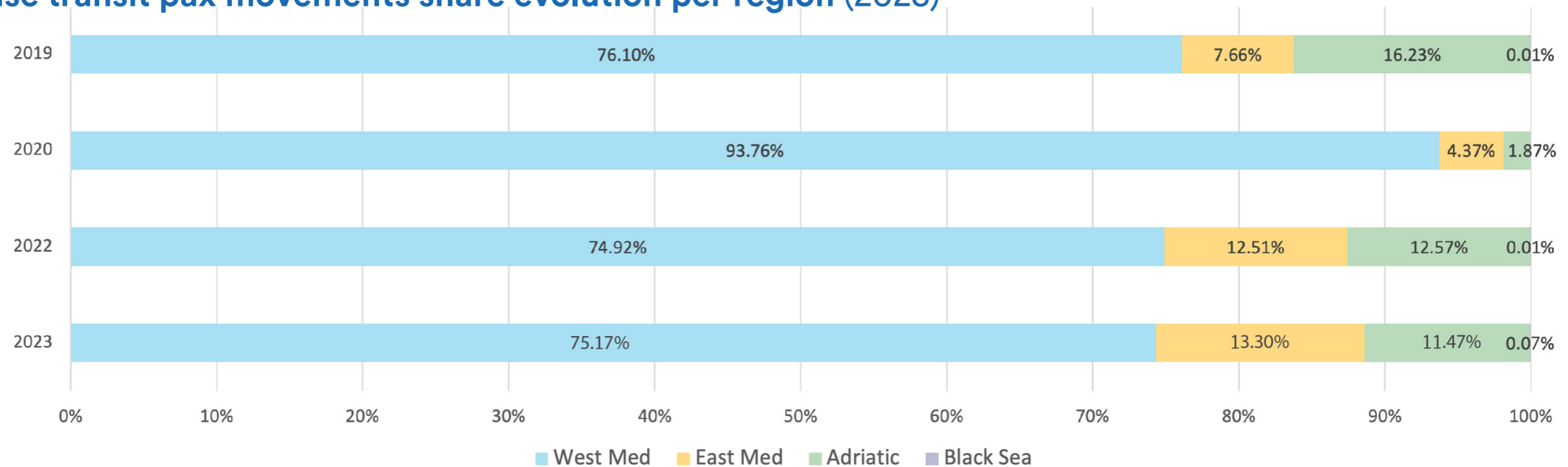
4.2 Cruise traffic evolution per region

Compared to 2022, the total transit passenger traffic in the Med and its adjoining seas has increased by 38%, and compared to 2020, it has seen a staggering increase of 1,600%. As for the pre-pandemic results, the increase of transit passengers in the MedCruise ports is 8.93%. In terms of market share (Figure 4.5), the ports in the West Med region represent the 75% of the cruise transit pax movements, followed by the East Med ports (13.30%).

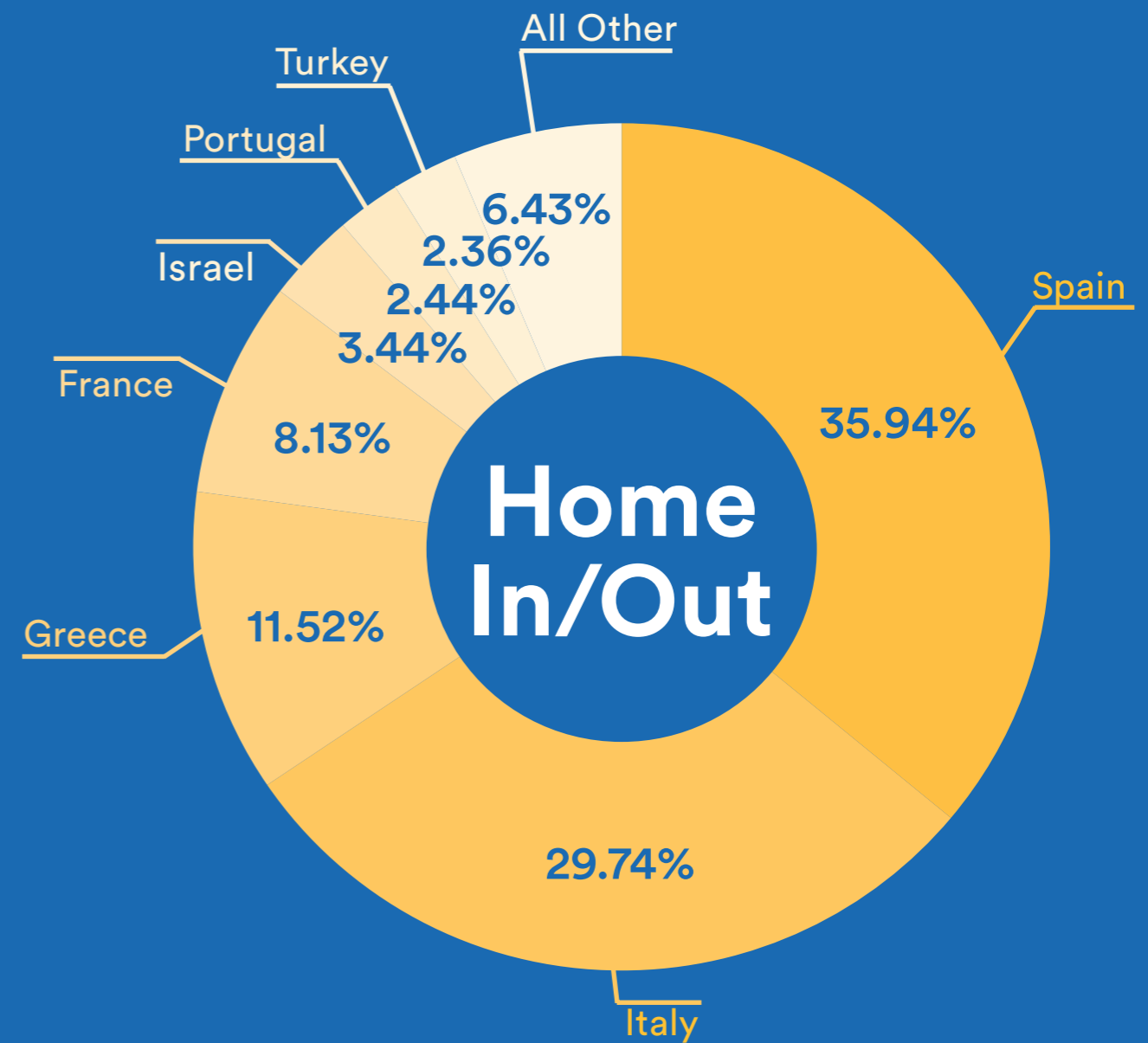
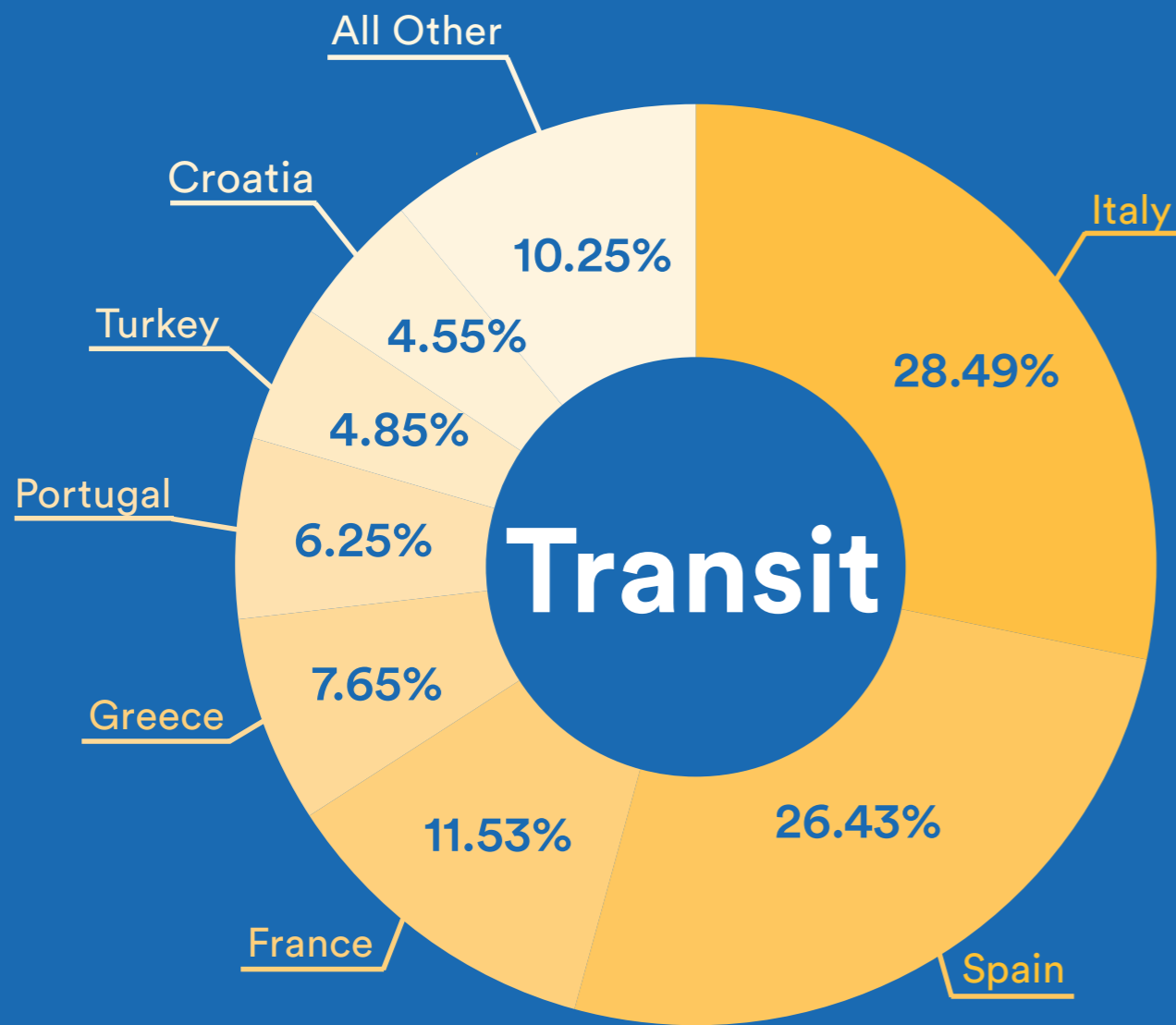

Seasonality analysis



5.1 Seasonality in MedCruise ports

The seasonality of cruise activities in MedCruise ports is the theme of this section of the report. The focus is on how cruise traffic is distributed on a monthly and seasonal basis. The report also discusses variations depending on the region where a port is located. Figure 5.1 illustrates the share of passenger movements and cruise calls per month in 2023. Of note is that from May to October passenger movements represented 73.2% of total passenger movements for the year. In the same period the 70% of the total calls for the year were recorded.

Cruise traffic shares per month (2023)

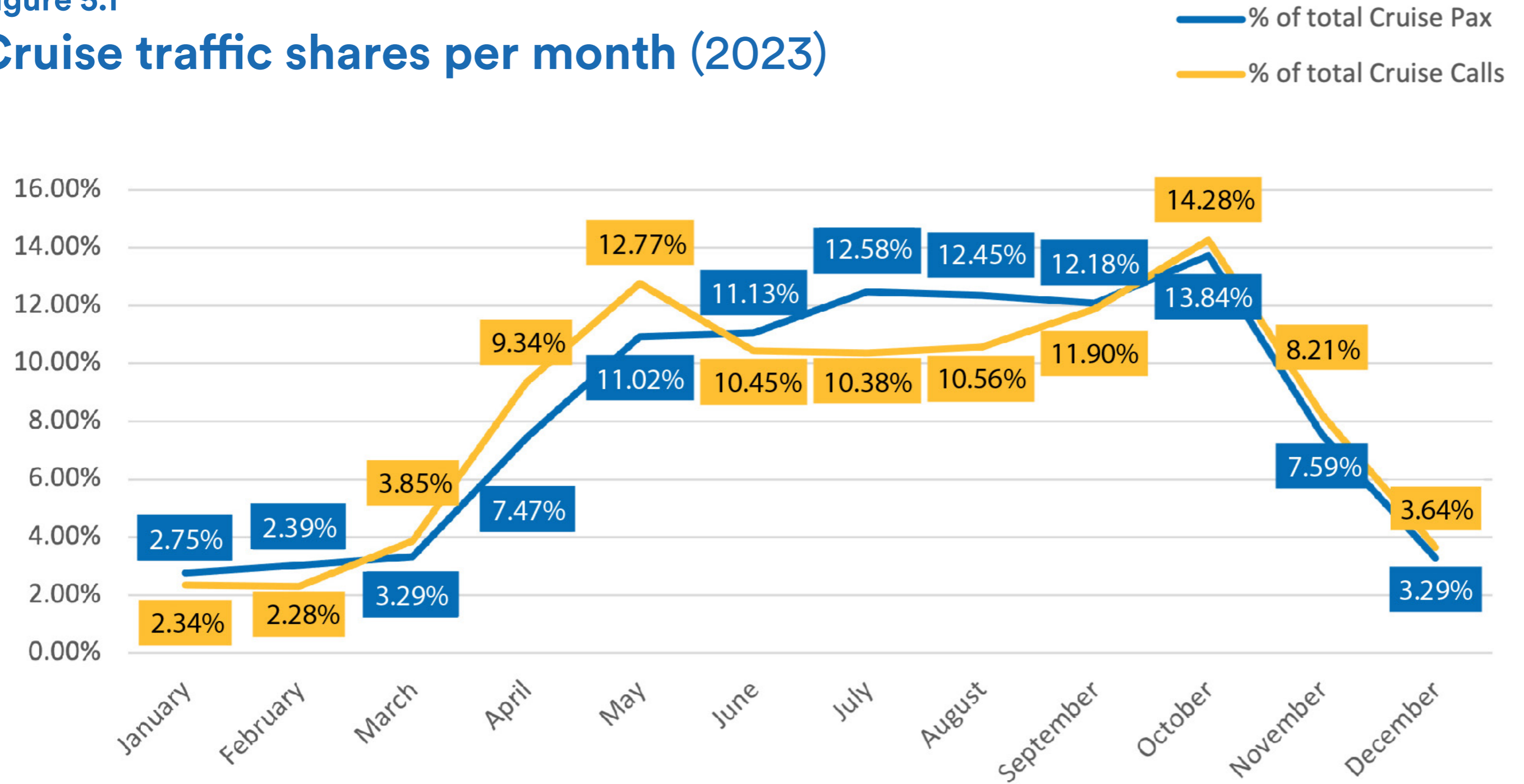
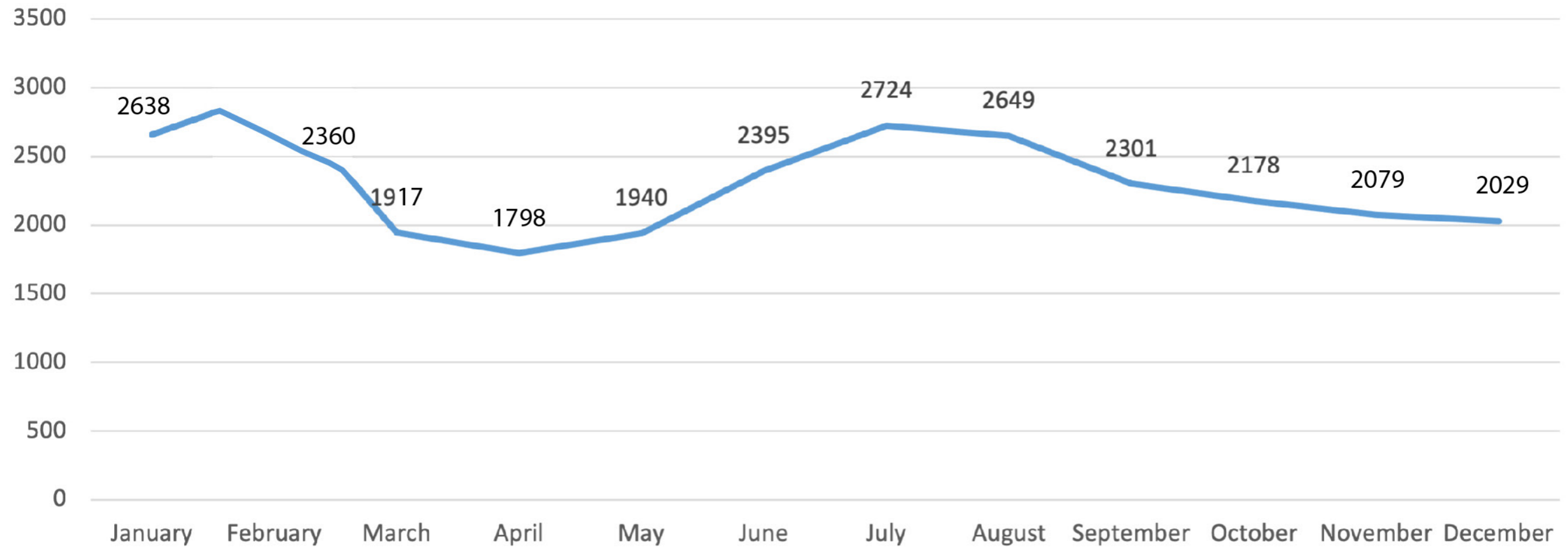
